Preparing Today's Youth for STEM Careers and Job Opportunities

Two hundred and forty (240), high school and college students 14-21 years old from the Washington DC area participated in Children & Charity International (CAC) summer activities during 2013 and 2014. These youth joined us from Mayor Vincent C. Gray Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP). Continuing an 8th year partnership with the

Department of Employment Services (DOES) qualified youth enjoyed an integrated learning experience of academics, work-readiness skills, field trips, team projects and fun with Children & Charity International for 6 weeks from June to August each year.

Fifty-five middle school students 3rd thru 8th grade from public and private schools also joined

CAC and were the recipients of highly informative and engaging summer activities to stimulate the brain and prevent summer learning loss.

All participants enjoyed learning activities that included science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). Field trips and social interactions provided real world experiences and fun for the students.

- Provide mentoring and leadership training for youth.
- Support parents and caregivers.
- Organize field trips, book fairs, brunches and hands-on activities for participants.
- Support international education, feeding, and health-care projects and support disaster relief efforts.

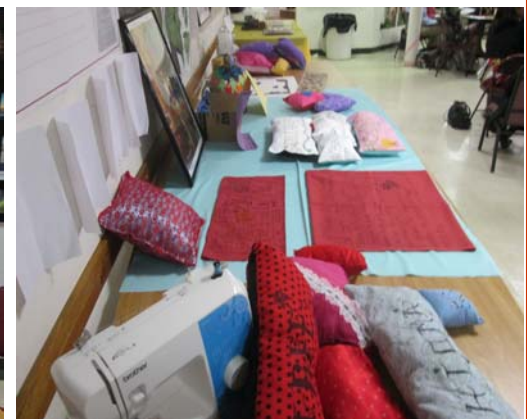
A Message from the Chair

CAC coordinated a medical mission trip to Haiti from July 18-25, 2013 lead by Dr. Anne Boyd from Michigan. The aim was to provide much needed health and dental services for poor people in three communities. CAC also provided five (5) days of special services to 1500 local students through Vacation Bible School (VBS), Computer Literacy and English as a Second Language . Five (5) middle, high school and college level students participated in this trip and provided instruction and support for the children’s program. We were fortunate to have Alexis Boyd, a College Junior whose proficiency in French was outstanding and made for easier interaction and communication. Alexis also videotaped and photographed trip activities. Students enjoyed the arts and crafts, music (singing and dancing), and the films. Hot meals and cultural exchanges added fun to the sessions.

This mission is an effort to support the work of Institute of Grace (IOG) project at Miracia Hospital in Merger Haiti. The Miracia Hospital project serves 20,000 residents of Merger and surrounding communities who do not have access to healthcare. The 10 member medical/professional team served over 1200 residents from Merger, Archaie and Jacmel during their 8 days trip. Everyone enjoyed the experience and are looking forward to the next mission trip.

Ebola Relief Effort

As part of the 2014 Ebola Relief Effort, and in support of affected children, and families, the Family Café of Children & Charity International has been working with local on-site service teams to distribute disinfectant, cleaning products and supplies to community residents in Grand Bassa County, Monrovia Liberia.

CAC has been supporting children and families in Liberia for many years through education and job-readiness projects. This Ebola crisis adds a new dimension to our continued support. Updates are posted on the website.

Collaboration

In 2014, CAC joined forces with St. Augustine Catholic School and continued partnership with the District of Columbia Public Schools (DCPS), DC Children and Youth Investment Trust and the Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services (DYRS) to provide math and science enrichment, homework help, Job training, apprenticeship opportunities and social activities for youth in the District of Columbia.

We look forward to continuing the task of preparing DC youth for STEM careers and the world of work.
